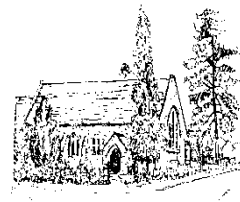

ADDITIONAL NOTES

MAIN MARRIAGE PREPARATION MEETINGS:

There are normally around three meetings prior to the wedding service. At the first, we fill out a banns form and discuss practical details such as are listed on this form. At the second, we look together at the marriage service and the meaning of Christian marriage. And at the third, we rehearse the ceremony in church.

BANNS:

A marriage in church normally takes place after the 'reading of banns'. Banns must be read within three months of the wedding, on three consecutive Sundays, in the parish or parishes where the bride and groom are resident. If they are being married outside of these parishes, in the church where they are regular worshippers and on the 'electoral roll' (as church members), they must have their banns read there too. **This is a legal requirement.** A priest cannot conduct a marriage service, until he has received certificates from the relevant churches, to show that the banns have been read. If one or other of you has a foreign passport, then a Common license is generally required in place of banns.

We always pray for couples, when their banns are read. We would be delighted to see you on these days, and indeed would encourage you to come on other occasions too as part of your spiritual preparation.

We have a legal responsibility to check you are who you say you are and have a right to be married in Great Britain, so need to see proof of identification.

Statutory Fees:

Wedding Service <i>(inclusive of all preparatory meetings and rehearsal)</i>	£455.00
Wedding Certificate	£4.00

Additional Charges:

**NB We pay the organist double (i.e. an additional £70.00) for performance rights, if the service is filmed or recorded.*

'Qualifying Connections'

You can legally marry in the Church of England church of your choice if you can show: -

1. That one of you:
 - a) has at any time lived in the parish for a period of at least 6 months, or
 - b) was baptised in the parish concerned, or
 - c) was prepared in the parish for confirmation, or
 - d) has at any time attended normal church services in the parish church for a period of at least 6 months, or
2. That one of your parents, at any time after you were born:
 - a) has lived in the parish for a period of at least 6 months, or
 - b) has regularly attended normal church services in the parish church for a period of at least 6 months, or
3. That one of your parents or grandparents:
was married in the parish.

In all cases involving church services – i.e. going to normal church services, baptism, confirmation or marriage – the above applies only to Church of England services.
